

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the [Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage](#). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 April 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to children's safety and welfare. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 16 April 2025, we carried out an unannounced regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. We found that the provider has reviewed the deployment of staff to ensure children are always adequately supervised. They have provided staff with additional training in safeguarding to ensure they understand their roles and responsibilities to keep children safe. The provider has reviewed how they monitor and evaluate staff practice to identify areas for improvement. The provider has also made changes to the curriculum to better support children's understanding of how to keep themselves safe.

At the visit, although not part of the original concerns, we found that the provider was not meeting some of the requirements regarding toilets and intimate hygiene. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 23 April 2025:

ensure children's bathrooms, equipment and nappy changing areas are kept clean and suitable for use, including making sure children have access to toilet paper

fully support children to develop their independence in personal care routines and help them to understand why good hygiene practices, such as flushing the toilet after use are important.

On 23 April 2025, the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had taken appropriate steps to address the actions set. Signage and checklists are displayed to support staff in making sure effective hygiene routines are implemented, and managers will be monitoring this. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
