

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 5 May 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to health. On 14 May 2026 we received a further notification relating to staff: child ratios. The notifications mean that the provider meets their legal responsibility as set out in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage' to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 23 June 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting one requirement. We have issued an action for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 7 July 2026:

- ensure effective staff supervision that provides support, coaching and training for the practitioner to promote the interests of children.

On 3 July 2026, the provider responded to the action set. We found that the provider had improved the documentation for recording supervision and provided guidance on what makes an effective supervision.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
