Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the safeguarding and welfare requirements of the early years foundation stage. She has addressed the weaknesses identified at her previous inspection and has maintained a valid paediatric first-aid qualification to help her keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how to safeguard children and report any concerns she may have about a child's welfare. She understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle, such as through daily exercise.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of how young children learn. She demonstrates, through conversation, how she would support the learning and development of children of different ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing strong partnerships with parents and other providers who may also be caring for children. She is aware of the need to share information effectively to support children's individual needs.
- The childminder understands that she must regularly review her practice and continuously develop her professional skills and knowledge to ensure that they improve further and meet the needs of children effectively. She has a range of policies and procedures to help her organise her provision well.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
