Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to observe and assess children's progress to identify any gaps and plan for their next steps. She acknowledges the importance of evaluating her practice and the advantage of involving others, such as parents and other professionals, to help identify areas for improvement.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of safeguarding children issues and the procedures to follow in the event of concerns.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of keeping her knowledge up to date to ensure she is informed of any changes in legislation.
- The childminder has a positive attitude towards inclusion and understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others to meet children's needs. She plans to provides children with equal access to a good variety of resources to support their learning.
- The childminder plans to promote children's health and well-being. Arrangements for the provision of healthy snacks and meals are clear about individual dietary needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed relevant documentation, including evidence of Paediatric first-aid training and public liability insurance.
- The inspector asked the childminder questions throughout the inspection to establish her understanding of how to safeguard children and how she monitors their learning and development.
- The inspector viewed the resources and the areas of the home used by children.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed the play activities and children's learning during the inspection.
