

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 October 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be not met. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements. Following the inspection we served a welfare requirements notice on 2 November 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 13 November 2023:

- ensure full paediatric first-aid training is maintained and renewed every three years
- improve knowledge of and arrangements for accessing support for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

On 14 November 2023, we carried out a monitoring visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. At the visit we found the provider had met the actions. The provider now has a current paediatric first-aid certificate in place and understands the requirement to keep this up to date. The provider was able to demonstrate a secure knowledge and understanding of how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. They are also aware of how to correctly make referrals to other professionals to access early help for children.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
