

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 28 August 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to concerns about children's safety and welfare and suitable people. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of any person who cares for/is in regular contact with children on the premises.

On 28 October 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 18 November 2025:

- ensure all those with lead safeguarding roles have up-to-date training and knowledge of safeguarding issues in line with relevant local safeguarding partnership guidance
- implement robust procedures for regular staff supervision, coaching, and mentoring to effectively support staff in their roles, promote professional development, and provide opportunities for confidential discussions around sensitive issues
- maintain an accurate record of the names of the children being cared for on the premises, their hours of attendance and the names of each child's key person

On 5 November 2025, the provider responded to the action set. We found that safeguarding training had been arranged for lead staff, and safeguarding policies and procedures had been reviewed and updated. The provider had strengthened systems for staff supervision, coaching, and mentoring, and had improved arrangements for recording attendance. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
