Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to develop her skills and keeps up to date effectively with new guidelines and requirements. For example, she has updated her safeguarding policy to include new information to keep children safe.
- The childminder intends to develop partnerships with parents and other professionals to help with continuity of children's learning.
- The childminder intends to support children's developing self-esteem. For example, she plans to use praise to help build on their emotional well-being.
- The childminder intends to monitor children's progress and identify any gaps in learning. She intends to put plans in place to help ensure all children make good progress.
- The childminder knows how to be a good role model. She knows how to plan to encourage children's good behaviour and support a healthy lifestyle. For example, she intends to visit the dentist and teach children about the dangers of sugars in food.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to prepare children for school. She intends to help them with a variety of activities, such as developing independence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the areas used for childminding.
- The inspector and childminder discussed her knowledge of safeguarding, risk assessment, child development and self-evaluation.
- The inspector reviewed the resources and talked to the childminder about how she intends to plan activities to support children's learning.
- The inspector sampled documentation, including planning, policies and procedures.
