Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of implementing safeguarding procedures to enable her to keep children safe. She knows how to identify possible signs of harm and how to refer these to the relevant agencies within required timescales.
- The childminder understands how to promote the well-being of children and positively manage behaviour. She demonstrates, through discussion, that she knows how to provide healthy food, fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing relationships with parents and others, to further support children in her care and to build on their learning experiences.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements. She has used successful recording systems for children's progress in the past.
- The childminder updates her knowledge and understanding of childcare by attending training courses and seeking support from advisers, to continually improve her skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
