Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has addressed the action raised at her last inspection. She has taken action to notify Ofsted of persons living on the premises.
- The childminder demonstrates a thorough understanding of her responsibilities to health, safety and safeguarding. She knows how to identify and minimise hazards to keep children safe in her home. She has clear procedures for administering medication and reporting accidents.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing safe and secure relationships with children to support their emotional well-being. She has appropriate systems in place to gather important information about children when they start.
- The childminder understands the importance of children leading healthy lifestyles through having physical play outdoors and access to a healthy diet. She knows and understands how to manage children's dietary needs and allergies appropriately.
- The childminder understands how to plan for children's individual learning and provide an ambitious and challenging curriculum for all. She demonstrates secure understanding of the importance of identifying gaps in children's learning and working with parents and other professionals to address this. To ensure all children make good progress.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour effectively. For example, she explains how she would ensure that consistent and age-appropriate boundaries are in place. She understands that children need sufficient challenge in activities to help them remain engaged and focused.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's development. To help provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder has suitable knowledge and understands how to support children with special educational needs and or/disabilities and those who speak English as an additional language.
- The childminder uses self-evaluation to identify areas where she can build on her own practice. For example, by attending regular training on issues, such as safeguarding, child protection and the early years foundation stage. This ensures her knowledge and understanding remains current.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
