Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to keep children safe from harm. She knows how to identify if children are at risk of harm and how to report concerns about children's welfare, in order to keep them safe.
- The areas used for childminding are welcoming and accessible to all. The childminder understands how to ensure that children can make independent choices from toys and resources within her home.
- The childminder knows how to make observations and assessments of children's learning to monitor their progress. The childminder knows how to plan activities which focus on their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other professionals to share information about children's learning and care to support their individual needs.
- The childminder knows how to help children learn about the importance of positive behaviour. She knows how to help children learn to value and respect the differing needs of others to build strong friendships.
- The childminder demonstrates through discussion how she plans to promote healthy lifestyles with the children through healthy food choices and opportunities for physical activities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled relevant documentation that the childminder uses when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at the areas of the home used for childminding.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder of how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of safeguarding procedures.
