Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to provide a welcoming and stimulating environment for children. She understands that children need opportunities to play and learn outdoors and indoors.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. For example, she knows how to assess children's abilities and needs, and address any gaps in their learning to help children of different ages to progress.
- The childminder knows about safeguarding practices and the reporting procedures to follow if she has any welfare concerns.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She knows that parents should be kept informed about their children's progress and daily activities.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping her childcare knowledge up to date. She is committed to attending training courses in childcare, to help her continue to meet the learning and development needs of babies and young children.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and the importance of risk assessments. She knows that she must routinely ensure all areas of her home remain safe and suitable for children in her care.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the requirements of the early years foundation stage and other statutory requirements with the childminder to establish her knowledge and understanding.
- The inspector reviewed the documentation that the childminder will use when caring for children in the early years age range.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's home to be used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed and reviewed the play resources the childminder plans to provide for children.
- The inspector reviewed evidence of the childminder's qualifications and suitability to care for children.
