Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has evaluated her practice since the last inspection. She has completed a first-aid qualification, as required. She understands how to help children learn about the diverse world they live in and to recognise their own and other people's uniqueness.
- The childminder understands how to plan a range of activities and experiences to help children learn new skills and make progress in their development.
- The childminder has a variety of ways to support children to learn to manage their feelings and behaviour, such as providing clear explanations to help develop empathy for each other.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and with professionals at other settings children attend, such as school.
- The childminder has a wide range of resources to help support children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands how to protect children's welfare and keep them safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2010. She lives in Loudwater, Buckinghamshire. The childminder provides childcare all year round and for children before and after school, and during the school holidays. She holds qualified teacher status. There were no children on roll in the early years age range at the time of inspection.
