Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder values the importance of evaluating her practice to maintain the quality of her childminding service. For example, she regularly attends local early years forums to keep herself fully informed.
- The childminder understands how to support children's healthy lifestyles. For example, providing regular opportunities for children to engage in physical activities and outings, such as trips to local parks, museums and farms.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning well, including how to monitor their development and plan challenging activities to support their individual needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of continuous professional development. She regularly accesses training and is currently working towards a higher qualification to extend her knowledge and skills further.
- The childminder knows what to do if she is concerned about a child's welfare. She knows the local procedure to follow to report her concerns and the action to take to address any extreme views and beliefs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed areas of the childminder's home to be used for the purpose of childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of requirements and how she will support children's learning and care.
- The inspector viewed relevant documentation, including the childminder's public liability insurance, safeguarding policy and procedures, and paediatric first-aid qualification.

The childminder registered in 2010. She lives in Anerley in the London Borough of Bromley. The childminder provides care for children, Monday to Friday from 7am until 7pm, for most of the year. The childminder has a relevant level 3 childcare qualification.
