Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She is clear about how to promote the seven areas of learning and plan for children's individual learning needs.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities in safeguarding children. She is familiar with the local safeguarding procedures to follow in the event of concerns arising about children's welfare.
- The childminder has a wide selection of quality resources to engage and challenge children of different ages and stages.
- The childminder shares her policies and procedures with parents and demonstrates a clear understanding of working closely in partnership with parents to meet the needs of children.
- The childminder risk assesses her setting effectively to ensure that children's safety and well-being is fully promoted.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked the childminder's documentation required to meet registration requirements, such as her public liability insurance.
- The inspector discussed the learning and development requirements and how the childminder intends to promote children's learning needs.
- The inspector discussed safeguarding procedures and what the childminder would do in the event of a concern.
- The inspector toured the areas that are used for childminding purposes and reviewed toys and equipment available.
- The inspector discussed documents the childminder uses when caring for children, such as children's records, attendance, accident and medication documents.
