Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of how to provide an effective curriculum to support children's learning. She understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She can explain how she will plan activities based on children's interests and what they already know. She has a wide range of resources and provided examples of how to support children of different ages, across the areas of learning.
- The childminder discussed her strategies for promoting appropriate behaviour. She demonstrated her knowledge of providing praise to support children's good behaviour and how to manage unwanted behaviour effectively.
- The childminder demonstrates her knowledge of using observations and assessments to help monitor the progress children make. She intends to use the information to support her when planning future activities based on what children need to learn next and help them develop skills for their future learning.
- The premises are clean, welcoming and safe. The childminder understands how to support good hygiene routines and emphasise the health and well-being of children. She intends to provide many opportunities for physical play in the local community and has a range of resources to develop children's physical abilities.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of child protection issues and of her responsibility to keep children safe from harm. She knows the procedures to follow and how to make a referral if she has any concerns regarding a child's welfare.
- The childminder organises her home effectively and completes regular checks to minimise risks. The childminder has public liability insurance and has completed paediatric first-aid training, which enables her to manage any injuries that children might have in the home or on outings.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to maintain a consistent approach. She understands the need to keep parents updated on their children's progress and to involve them in their learning, including by sharing ideas to support learning at home.
- The childminder is committed to improving her knowledge and skills. She keeps up to date with current early years practice and completes mandatory training. The childminder knows the importance of seeking views from parents and children, to help review her provision and make improvements to her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
