**The quality and standards of the early years provision**

**The provision meets requirements**

- The childminder demonstrates an awareness of the statutory requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The childminder demonstrates an awareness of how to support children's learning and development through observational assessment. He understands the need to work with parents and ensure he provides appropriate learning experiences to enable children to make progress.
- The childminder demonstrates an appropriate understanding of supporting children's well-being, such as supporting children's health and having an awareness of safeguarding procedures. He understands where to seek advice in the event of a safeguarding concern, in order to promote children's welfare.
- The childminder attends regular training offered by his local authority, to develop his knowledge of childcare practice and improve the quality of provision for any children he may care for.

## Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the compulsory part of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to explore his understanding of the learning and development requirements, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at areas of the home used for childminding, indoors and outdoors.
- The inspector looked at a sample of the documents that the childminder uses when childminding, and the policies and procedures he shares with parents.
- The inspector spoke to childminder about how he intends to develop his role further through self-evaluation and about the range of childminding related training he has attended since registration.

### Information about the setting

The childminder registered in 2010. He lives with his wife, their son, and an adult nephew, in Seven Kings, within the London Borough of Redbridge. Children have access to the whole of the ground floor, and one bedroom and bathroom on the first floor. There is a garden for outdoor play with access to an outdoor toilet. The childminder currently has no children on roll. The childminder is registered to work with another childminder. The childminder is registered on the Early Years Register, and both the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register.

## Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted) regulates and inspects to achieve excellence in the care of children and young people, and in education and skills for learners of all ages. It regulates and inspects childcare and children's social care, and inspects the Children and Family Court Advisory Support Service (Cafcass), schools, colleges, initial teacher training, work-based learning and skills training, adult and community learning, and education and training in prisons and other secure establishments.
