Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She is aware of her role to support children to make progress in relation to their starting points.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's health and well-being. She understands the importance of providing children with regular experiences outdoors, daily exercise and a healthy diet.
- The childminder understands the need to help children learn to respect others and behave appropriately.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers. She understands her role to share information with them on a regular basis to provide continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder understands her role to safeguard children and the procedures to follow to report any concerns about children's welfare and safety.
- The childminder understands the importance of reviewing her practice and seeking parents' views about what she offers in order to decide plans for improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
