Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn. She demonstrates a sufficient awareness of the seven areas of learning and understands how to monitor children's ongoing development to help them gain the necessary skills needed for school.
- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents and other professionals involved in children's care, to help provide continuity in meeting their needs.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's health and well-being. For instance, she comprehends the significance of teaching children about healthy practices and the benefits of fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder has a sufficient awareness of her roles and responsibilities to keep children safe. She is aware of the need to act in the children's best interests in the event of a child protection concern.
- The childminder realises the importance of updating her training and understands the importance of evaluating her practice to help advance her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she supports and delivers the educational programmes for children.
