Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to observe and monitor children's progress, to help her plan and provide a range of activities to promote children's learning.
- The childminder knows what to do if she has a concern about the welfare of a child. She understands how to maintain a safe environment and to minimise hazards.
- The childminder is committed to continuously improving outcomes for children and undertakes research and training to support her knowledge and skills.
- The childminder understands how to help children feel safe and secure, and prepare them for their future learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents and other early years settings in order to help her to meet children's individual care and learning needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
