Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder discussed how she would gather information from parents about what children know when they first start. She would use this information to plan what they need to learn next to make sure children make the best progress. Her curriculum will be tailored to children's individual needs and interests.
- The childminder knows the importance of working in partnership with parents to make sure that they are involved in their child's care and education.
- The childminder is confident to talk about how she would safeguard children in her care. She has written procedures that she would follow in the event of a concern. The childminder provides a safe and secure environment for children.
- The childminder described appropriate strategies to manage children's behaviour. She would make sure that the environment is inclusive and takes account of the needs of all children.
- The childminder talked through her procedures to monitor and evaluate her provision to make sure that she makes continuous improvement.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
