## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of child protection issues and she knows how to report any concerns to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to use feedback from parents and children to help evaluate and improve her practice. She understands the importance of maintaining her professional development to keep her knowledge current.
- The childminder recognises the importance of maintaining a three-way flow of communication with parents and other providers that children attend to share information about children's progress and what they should do next.
- The childminder knows how to set clear boundaries for children to know what is acceptable and unacceptable. She recognises the benefits of praising and rewarding children's efforts and achievements.
- The childminder knows how to plan play opportunities for children to enjoy and to help them make progress. She describes ways to support children's independence. For example, to allow them to choose and make decision about their play.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide activities and experiences that support children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the policies and documents that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation and her improvement plan.
- The inspector viewed resources and had a tour of the premises that she intends to use for children.
