Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder and her assistant do not know enough about how to safeguard children. They do not know about procedures for reporting concerns about a child's welfare and have not updated their knowledge of the 'Prevent' duty guidance.
- The childminder does not have an effective evacuation procedure to ensure the safety of children.
- The childminder makes accessible her paediatric first-aid certificate and public liability insurance.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her service to maintain good standards.
- The childminder plans to make a range of information available to parents to promote partnership working.
- The childminder has clear knowledge of how to support children's learning. She knows how to use observation and assessment to help her plan for children's good progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of suitable hygiene procedures, healthy eating and an active lifestyle to support children's well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

The childminder registered in 2011. She lives in Thornton Heath in the London Borough of Croydon. The childminder's service is available between 7.30am and 6.30pm each weekday, all year round.
