Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to safeguard children. For example, she knows how to recognise and report child protection concerns. She has a good understanding of identifying and minimising risks to children, to help protect them from harm.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice and asking for children's and parents' feedback to help her to improve.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's health and physical well-being. She knows how to help them gain knowledge of the wider world and learn how to keep themselves safe, including on outings.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of the importance of partnerships with parents and other professionals to help ensure continuity in meeting children's needs.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of helping children gain the skills to prepare them for the next stage of their learning, including school. The childminder describes how she plans to use assessments and observations of children's learning to plan activities which meet their needs and interests.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises where childcare will be provided. She also viewed and discussed the available resources.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her understanding of the early years foundation stage framework and how she implements this in practice.
- The inspector sampled some of the childminder's documentation, including training and suitability records.

The childminder registered in 2011 and lives in Hayes, Middlesex. She operates all year round from 7.30am until 7.30pm, on Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.
