Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements.
- The childminder knows how to plan stimulating activities to promote children's learning and to monitor their progress. She understands how to adapt activities to meet all children's needs and suitably prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children's positive behaviour and implement positive attitudes to others, whatever their backgrounds, ages and abilities.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing good hygiene, healthy meals and daily outdoor exercise as part of promoting children's healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder knows the procedures to follow if she has concerns about children's safety and welfare. The childminder ensures her home is safe and regularly reviews the risks for potential hazards.
- The childminder understands the value of developing partnerships with parents, different professionals and other early years settings children attend to fully promote children's education.
- The childminder understands the importance of training and self-evaluation in improving her provision for children and their families.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held conversations with the childminder during the inspection, including discussions about her understanding of the requirements.
- The inspector sampled some of the childminder's documentation, including her policies and procedures.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's suitability and qualifications.
- The inspector viewed the premises and resources available for children.
