Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a strong knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare, and learning and development of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She discusses how she intends to extend this further through use of self-evaluation and training.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of the importance of risk assessment to help keep children safe. She is knowledgeable about child protection matters and the procedure to follow if she has any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder's home is safe and clean. She has a wide range of play resources available to meet the needs of young children.
- The childminder has suitable processes in place for completing assessments on children and for tracking their progress. She gives good examples of how she would support children's learning through play and practical experiences to help them prepare for school.
- The childminder has clear procedures for securing partnership with parents and any other early years settings involved with children.
- The childminder demonstrates through discussion her understanding how to help children learn about leading healthy and active lifestyles through outdoor play experiences and a healthy diet.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and how she will meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at the records and documentation the childminder has for use when caring for children, including those related to safeguarding and the childminder's suitability to work with children.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the premises, including some play resources.
