Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has maintained a good understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She is able to use her skills and experience of working in a childcare environment to demonstrate this knowledge.
- The childminder demonstrates an effective awareness of how to implement her policies and procedures to keep children safe and healthy, and support their well-being. She is mindful to consider children's needs and provide an environment for children to feel emotionally secure in her care.
- The childminder has completed relevant paediatric first-aid training and is confident to act in times of medical emergency.
- The childminder demonstrates confidence of how to safeguard children. She reviews her risk assessments regularly. The childminder has a good understanding of child protection matters. She demonstrates her awareness of the procedures to follow should she have a concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She is aware of the benefits of working with parents so that she can assess children's development and use background knowledge of children's interests and routines.
- The childminder demonstrates how she will provide activities, toys and resources to promote how children engage in their play. She understands the importance of tracking children's achievements and planning for their individual next steps.
- The childminder is reflective of her provision. She is proactive in attending further training to enhance her professional development and outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and how she meets the requirements.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she will promote children's learning and development.
- The inspector sampled some of the childminder's documentation.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she will safeguard children.
- The inspector observed the childminder's home, toys and resources.
