Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to help children prepare for school. She plans to support children to develop independence and confidence and build on their developing self-esteem.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing her skills and keeping up to date with new guidelines and requirements. For example, she has attended training and keeps her safeguarding knowledge current.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the value of building relationships with schools and other settings children may attend. She knows how to work with parents and other professionals to ensure consistency in meeting each child's needs.
- The childminder plans to teach children about how to keep safe and be aware of their own personal safety. For example, she plans to demonstrate how to cross a road safely.
- Since the last inspection, the childminder has purchased extra resources, such as a wireless microscope and other equipment to enable her to support children's understanding of technology, especially in the outdoor area.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the premises used for childminding.
- The inspector and childminder discussed her knowledge of safeguarding, risk assessment, child development and self-evaluation.
- The inspector reviewed the resources and talked to the childminder about how she would plan activities to support children's learning.
- The inspector discussed documentation, such as planning, policies and procedures.
