Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she intends to protect children from harm. She describes how she would involve children in risk assessments to enable them to develop an understanding of how to keep themselves safe. She knows how to identify the potential signs of abuse and neglect, and she understands the local reporting procedures.
- The experienced childminder has systems in place to observe, assess and plan for children's individual learning. She describes how she intends to use what she knows about children to target the areas of development that require the most support. The childminder explains how she plans to provide a wide range of experiences for children to help them to make the best possible progress.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing establishing professional relationships with parents. She describes how information would be shared between herself and parents regularly to promote consistency in care and learning.
- The childminder describes how she intends to use self-evaluation to reflect on her provision and maintain the good quality. She explains how she intends to gather the views of parents and children, such as through regular questionnaires.
- The childminder describes how she plans to support children's good health. For instance, she intends to provide children with a healthy diet and daily physical exercise.
- The childminder recognises the importance of teaching children to respect differences between themselves and others. She intends to provide opportunities for children to learn about cultures and people from around the world, such as through activities, resources and books. The childminder has a good awareness of how to provide an inclusive service for children and families.
- The childminder attends mandatory training, such as child protection and first aid. She has plans in place to help her to enhance her skills and knowledge even further, such as through links with other childminders and targeted training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children and undertake assessment of their development.
- The inspector discussed self-evaluation and improvement plans with the childminder.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other members of her household.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements and the systems she has in place to keep children safe.
- The inspector viewed the areas where childminding will take place and the resources that the childminder will provide.

The childminder registered in 2011 and lives in Sale, Greater Manchester. She operates all year round from 7.15am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds an appropriate qualification at level 3.
