## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is reflective of her own practice and strives to improve her knowledge further, specifically with regards to improving her knowledge of special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- The environment is well organised and offers a range of resources to support children's learning and development. The childminder considers diversity by providing a wide range of multi-cultural toys and books, showing careful consideration to the children in the local area.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of the early years foundation stage framework. She understands how assessment helps to plan next steps for children and how each child is unique. She also considers ways to further develop children's learning and experiences, through outings to the library, the park or the museum.
- The childminder knows how to teach children to stay healthy. She understands the importance of cooking healthy meals and talking to the children about eating healthily and exercising.
- The childminder values parent partnership and understands how to work together effectively, such as giving daily feedback about activities completed throughout the day.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and is able to follow policies and procedures effectively.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
