Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the signs, symptoms and indicators of abuse. She knows the local authority's referral procedures and understands the correct steps to take if there is an allegation of abuse.
- The childminder is experienced and demonstrates an understanding of the learning and development requirements for children. She knows how to observe and assess children's progress and plan for their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the benefits of working with parents and other providers to ensure that she meets children's individual needs. She knows how to provide a consistent approach to children's learning.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to promote children's well-being. She is aware of the importance of providing children with a healthy diet and ensuring that they have regular opportunities to be active.
- The childminder understands how to review her practice and identify areas to improve.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observations, assessments and planning.
- The inspector discussed policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took account of suitability checks for persons living in the household.

The childminder registered in 2011 and lives in Doncaster. She operates all year round from 7.30am to 6pm, Monday to Thursday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds an appropriate qualification at level 3.
