Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has worked hard since her last inspection, including pursuing regular training opportunities to update her knowledge. She is aware of child protection issues and understands her responsibility to protect the welfare of children in her care.
- The childminder has diverse and age-appropriate resources available for children. She understands how to plan activities to support children's needs and help prepare them for school.
- The premises are safe, secure, clean and fit for purpose. The childminder knows how to undertake appropriate risk assessments to help minimise hazards.
- The childminder recognises the need to build effective links with other providers, including sharing information between other professionals and parents. She reviews her provision regularly and is dedicated to continuous improvement.
- The childminder knows how to help children to form secure relationships and develop their self-esteem. She understands how to positively manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of providing children with a choice of healthy meals and snacks, as well as a range of physical exercise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and documents the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's play and learning.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she monitors her provision, and develops partnerships with parents and other professionals.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment, and planning.
