Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote children's welfare effectively. She knows correct procedures to follow should she have concerns about the welfare of children in her care.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's behaviour. She understands the value to teaching to respect and care for each other.
- The importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help promote continuity of care and learning for children is well understood.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's learning in all areas. She understands how to use regular assessments in planning to ensure children make progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of the self-assessment and evaluation processes to improve her practice.
- The childminder understands how to promote healthy lifestyles and how to provide opportunities for children to be physically active.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the premises with the childminder.
- The inspector sampled some documentation, including evidence of suitability checks.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she would plan for and assess children's progress.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder to assess her understanding of her responsibilities to meet requirements.

The childminder registered in 2011. She lives in Hayes, in the London Borough of Hillingdon. The childminder operates each weekday, from 6.30am to 7pm, all year round, except on public bank holidays. There were no children on roll at the time of the inspection.
