Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the role she plays to promote children's welfare. For example, she knows what appropriate action to take if she has any safeguarding concerns.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's progress from the time of them starting and how to undertake ongoing required assessments. She recognises the importance of sharing information with parents and other settings children may attend.
- The childminder understands how to plan and provide appropriate learning experiences for children of varied ages, to ensure they make good progress across all areas of their development.
- The childminder is aware of how to manage children's behaviour and how to support children to value themselves and others who are different from themselves.
- The childminder is aware of the need to build on her professional development. For example, she explores different literature to extend her knowledge further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder to assess her knowledge and understanding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector viewed areas of the childminder's home used for minding.
- The inspector looked at a range of relevant documentation, including the childminder's policies and procedures shared with parents.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she uses self-evaluation to develop her practice; this included the recommendation raised at the last inspection.

The childminder registered in 2011. She lives in Romford, in the London Borough of Havering. She is available to mind children from Monday to Friday throughout most of the year. The childminder works with an assistant.
