Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She understands the need to provide children with a range of interesting and stimulating activities to help children make progress in their learning.
- The areas of the premises to be used for childminding are very welcoming. The childminder has a suitable range of toys and resources to help meet children's needs, and support their learning.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour positively. For example, she knows how to help children to build relationships with each other and to learn to respect and value diversity.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle, for instance, through healthy eating and daily exercise.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She knows the local authority's child protection procedures and understands her role in protecting children.
- The childminder understands the value of working in partnerships with parents and early years professionals to promote continuity in children's learning and well-being.
- The childminder makes use of training available to support her development. For example, she has gained an appropriate early years qualification. She understands the importance of self-evaluation to improve the outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector checked required documentation, including evidence of qualifications, suitability and training certificates.
- The discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her practice, particularly in relation to safeguarding.
- The inspector checked safety of the premises, toys and equipment.
