Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder stays up to date with requirements and legislation through online training. This includes training on safeguarding, which she explains keeps her informed on identifying abuse and reporting concerns. The childminder describes how she reflects regularly on her practice to meet children's needs and continually improve her provision.
- The childminder discusses how she provides a warm and welcoming environment, with dedicated playrooms for children. She highlights the importance of organising resources in accessible units, to give children the freedom to choose their own activities. The childminder explains that this will support children's confidence, encourage their independence and keep them engaged in their learning.
- The childminder has a secure garden with resources, such as footballs, to support children's physical development. She understands the significance of planning outings to the local park, where she will teach children about road safety and encourage them to wear high-visibility jackets. The childminder explains how she will conduct risk assessments before each trip to ensure children's safety, while also promoting fresh air, exercise and important life skills.
- Since the last inspection, the childminder has completed training to improve her knowledge of supporting children's independence. She plans to apply this by offering children choices at mealtimes to encourage their decision-making. The childminder describes how she will also encourage children to put on their own coats and shoes before school and at home time. Additionally, she explains how she will support children to use the toilet independently.
- The childminder plans to model positive behaviour and set clear expectations. She describes how she will teach children to share, take turns and resolve conflicts. The childminder explains she will encourage respect, empathy and good communication. She will reinforce these values at home and in her setting by working with parents and carers.
- The childminder understands the importance of building strong bonds with parents and maintaining good communication. She plans to provide daily feedback about their children's day, sharing insights on their progress. By offering ideas on how parents can support children's learning at home, the childminder aims to strengthen the home-to-setting connection, ensuring consistent development and support for each child.
- The childminder is knowledgeable about the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She understands how to support children's mathematical growth by introducing simple number activities based on their interests. The childminder explains that if she notices a delay in children's learning, she knows how to seek the necessary support. She is committed to monitoring each child's development and regularly sharing their progress with parents.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
