Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. She knows the correct procedures to follow to help safeguard children's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and promote children's learning to challenge them and help them make good progress in all areas.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to develop positive attitudes towards others and good behaviour to promote their social skills.
- The childminder understands how to help children develop self-confidence, good communication and independence to promote their future learning skills.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's healthy lifestyles. She has activities to help them learn about keeping themselves safe in the home and on outings.
- The childminder understands how to work with parents and any other settings children attend to promote their emotional well-being and learning consistently.
- The childminder provides suitable premises and play provision to promote all areas of children's learning.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her childminding practice to identify and make improvements for children. The childminder attends training courses to update her knowledge and skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
