Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder discusses her secure knowledge of how children learn through play, stimulation, challenge and exploration. She knows how to help the youngest children build foundations for learning and how to prepare older children for starting school.
- The childminder explains how she will help children make progress across all areas of their learning. She has robust arrangements for completing assessments of their development and procedures to follow to share this information with parents.
- The childminder knows how to help children develop confidence, independence and social skills. She understands how to manage their behaviour positively and how to help them develop respect for themselves and others in the wider world.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of building effective relationships and partnerships with children, families and other settings children attend, including schools. She knows how she will promote continuity of care and learning for children.
- The childminder understands her role to keep children safe from harm and who to report concerns to. She is aware of the need to ensure that the adults who may have access to children are suitable to do so and knows that she must supervise children at all times.
- The childminder has reflected on and maintained her skills to work with children. She has enhanced her knowledge of how to promote children's good health with particular regard to healthy eating and exercise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
