The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn through play. She understands the importance of assessing children's progress and using this information to plan for their next stage of development.
- The childminder provides children with a suitable range of resources and activities to promote their development through play.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating and playing outside to get fresh air.
- The childminder helps children learn to be independent and encourages them to manage their own personal care, for example, reminding them to wash their hands before meals.
- The childminder has a suitable knowledge and understanding of effective safeguarding procedures in order to protect the welfare of children.
- The childminder works with parents to ensure she meets children's individual needs. She obtains detailed information from parents so she is clear she fully understands the children's age and stage of development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
