## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates her commitment to self-evaluation. For example, she confirms she makes links with external agencies to help keep up to date with current guidance. Furthermore, the childminder has created a new and exciting environment for when children are on roll.
- The childminder can confidently identify different types of child protection issues. She understands the importance of raising her concerns about a child's welfare to external agencies to help keep children safe and from harm.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's good health. She describes how she will make use of community resources, such as local parks, to provide opportunities for children to have lots of exercise and plenty of fresh air.
- The childminder says she will help children to learn about different cultures and beliefs and promote an inclusive service. She understands the importance of valuing diversity to help promote children's sense of identity.
- The childminder appreciates the importance of working in partnership with parents, such as how to manage children's behaviour. She describes how she will discuss ongoing assessments of children's learning with parents for a consistent approach.
- The childminder successfully explains what she will intend children to learn. She describes how she will plan a challenging curriculum to build on what children know and can do to help all children make progress.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection of the provider since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder what she will intend children to learn and how this will impact on children's overall development and assessments for children.
- Documentation was viewed by the inspector. For example, paediatric first-aid certificate and public liability insurance.
- A tour of the premises used for the purpose of childminding was completed by the inspector and with the childminder. The childminder showed the inspector the premises and discussed how she will ensure they are safe and suitable.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
