Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to help children prepare for school. She understands how to use assessments to help plan activities for children to progress in their learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to complement children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She keeps up to date with child protection procedures to safeguard children. She knows the benefits of carrying out risk assessments to keep children safe and secure.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children to behave well, to show respect, share and take turns. She is aware of the need to raise children's awareness of how to lead a healthy lifestyle.
- The childminder has a very positive attitude towards professional development and recognises the importance of evaluating her childminding provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2012. She lives in Holmer Green, High Wycombe. She provides care 8am to 6.30pm Monday to Friday, all year round.
