Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to deliver the learning and development requirements and teach children the skills they need for their future education.
- The childminder is aware of the need to establish partnerships with parents and others to meet children's individual care and learning needs.
- The childminder meets all aspects of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She has a clear understanding of child protection procedures.
- The childminder keeps her home free from possible risks to children at all times. She understands the importance of teaching children how to stay safe.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to promote children's emotional and physical well-being. She knows how to encourage children's good behaviour.
- The childminder understands the need to monitor and evaluate the ongoing effectiveness of her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2012. She lives in Stoney Stratford, Milton Keynes. The childminder provides care from Monday to Friday 7.30am to 6pm, all year. There were no children on roll in the early years age group at the time of the inspection. The childminder has a level 3 qualification.
