Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows what action to take should any welfare concerns arise and how to provide quality learning experiences to help children make progress from their starting points.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with her co-childminder and monitoring the practices of her assistants to ensure that children's needs are met.
- The childminder understands the importance of supervising children's play and keeping her home safe and secure. For example, she knows how to complete daily safety checks to help minimise hazards to children.
- The childminder understands the importance of notifying Ofsted of significant changes as required. She recognises the importance of involving parents in their children's care and learning to help provide continuity.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour positively. She understands the importance of helping children to learn to share, consider others and value diversity.
- The childminder understands the importance of reviewing her practice and identifying areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the requirements of the early years foundation stage with the childminder to assess her knowledge and understanding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector sampled relevant documentation, including evidence of suitability records, children's attendance and accident records.
- The inspector checked all areas in the property used for childminding.
