Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the potential risks posed to children, including exposure to extreme views, unsafe technology, domestic abuse or alcohol misuse. She knows how to respond if she thinks a child is at risk of abuse or neglect or if an allegation is made against herself or a household member.
- The childminder describes the inclusive and enjoyable activities she will plan for children, based on their development needs and interests. She explains how she will assess children's learning and share information with their parents. The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals.
- The childminder shares how she will help children to understand her expectations, respect others and interact in positive ways. The childminder explains how she will support children to understand the different needs of their friends and learn about other communities and cultures.
- The childminder describes how she will promote children's health and hygiene. She will encourage children to wash their hands often and reviews arrival and collection procedures. The childminder explains how she will gather initial and ongoing information from parents to ensure children's individual care and learning needs are met. She discusses how she manages risks in her home and when on local outings.
- The childminder maintains links with local advisers and practitioners. She completes training to develop her professional practice. This helps her to share ideas and keep up to date with current developments.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
