The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The childminder knows how to maintain a safe and secure home for children. She has a good range of safe and suitable resources for children to play with.
- The childminder knows how to use observations of children to assess their progress and plan activities to extend their learning. She understands the importance of encouraging parents to be involved in children's learning and assessment.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being. She understands the need to provide a healthy diet, daily exercise and a clean environment.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to value and respect differences in the community. Likewise, to encourage social skills, such as sharing and being kind to others.
- The childminder has been keeping her knowledge up to date. For example, she has completed a number of childcare courses and sought advice from other professionals. The childminder has improved her awareness of current safeguarding procedures. She understands what to do if she has a child protection concern.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
