Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her duty to keep children safe and to notify Ofsted of anything that may affect her suitability. She recognises all indicators that a child may be at risk of harm and knows how to refer any concerns about a child's welfare. The childminder holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows how to monitor and assess children's learning, and plan activities to build on what children know and can do.
- The childminder provides a suitable environment for children's care. She understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's care, to meet their needs effectively.
- The childminder has carefully considered how she will evaluate her provision to maintain continuous improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
