Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role in safeguarding children. She can identify indicators of child abuse or neglect and knows how to act on any concerns.
- The childminder house is secure. She intends to conduct daily risk assessment checks, indoors and outside to help minimise any potential hazards or dangers.
- The childminder plans to help children learn about the importance of living healthily, including eating well, taking exercise and adopting good hygiene routines.
- The childminder intends to promote equality, diversity and inclusion. She plans to implement simple behaviour boundaries and encourage respect. She also plans to help children learn about their similarities and differences and encourage acceptance.
- The childminder's playroom is well resourced with a range of age-appropriate toys and equipment. She plans to foster children's motivation to play, explore and learn.
- The childminder knows how to observe children and assess their development. She intends to provide activities and experiences that help to build on their skills and eventually prepare them for school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises. She observed a suitable range of toys, equipment and resources, indoors and outside.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector checked evidence of the qualifications of the childminder.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and those she lives with.
- The inspector looked at the documents available, including relevant records, policies and procedures.
