Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder's understanding of the learning and development requirements is weak. She does not know how to observe children's learning and assess their progress. She does not know how to plan challenging and enjoyable learning experiences for children.
- The childminder has a poor understanding of the requirement to review the progress of children aged between two and three years. She lacks sufficient knowledge to ensure that important information is shared between herself, parents and other professionals.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of child protection procedures, she knows how to report any safeguarding concerns. She carries out risk assessments and takes appropriate action to minimise risks to children.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of encouraging children to enjoy outdoor physical play, to develop healthy eating habits and follow effective hygiene procedures to support their good health.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
