Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder shows a suitable understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements for children's learning and development. She explains how she will plan to support children to achieve well across all seven areas of learning. The childminder understands how to promote children's learning to help them to make progress.
- The childminder is not meeting all of the statutory requirements. She does not have public liability insurance in place or hold a current paediatric first-aid certificate. In addition, the childminder has not informed Ofsted about significant events that may affect her suitability to work with children.
- The childminder knows to gather detailed information from parents and carers to enable her to support children's individual care. She explains how she will identify children's starting points in development to plan a child-led curriculum.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of how to promote children's positive behaviour. She describes how she will develop children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The childminder discusses how she will promote children's well-being. For example, she explains how she intends to provide daily opportunities for children to use local parks to enjoy fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder accesses refresher training courses to update her knowledge on how to safeguard children. She is aware of the relevant agencies to contact if she has concerns about a child's well-being or if an allegation is made against her.
- The childminder knows the importance of carrying out risk assessments to identify hazards and remove any risks to ensure children's safety.
- The childminder demonstrates suitable knowledge of how to review the curriculum to ensure that children achieve positive outcomes from their starting points in development. For example, she explains how she will use her assessments to identify and address any gaps in children's knowledge.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
