Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder aims to provide a curriculum that meets the needs of individual children. She understands her responsibility to assess their progress and identify and address any gaps in their learning, to support them to catch up with their peers.
- The childminder aims to provide an inclusive environment in which all children feel welcome. She plans to help them to build on their independence.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnerships with parents. She plans to share information regularly with them to keep them updated of their children's time at her setting, and their progress. She plans to work closely with them to support and manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder reflects well on her provision and plans effectively for improvements. She has reviewed and improved her risk assessments to meet children's needs and keep them safe.
- The childminder understands how to identify and refer concerns for children's welfare. She understands the procedures to follow in the event of an allegation.
- The childminder aims to provide regular opportunities for children to play outdoors. She plans to provide healthy meals for children, to promote their well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's early communication and language skills. She plans to work closely with parents to meet the needs of individual children, including those who speak English as an additional language.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
