Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She knows how to plan and teach activities which meet the needs and interests of children and babies. She understands how to use observations to monitor children's progress.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice and understands how to use feedback from parents to improve her service. She understands how to share information with parents and other settings to promote children's learning and well-being.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of child protection and understands the procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's welfare. She keeps her home free from hazards; undertaking risk assessments to keep children safe.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's emotional development, health and well-being. She incorporates fresh air, healthy eating and exercise into the daily routine.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour. She promotes children's social skills and independence in readiness for their move to nursery or school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector toured the childminder's home and looked at the areas which are used by children.
- The inspector sampled the childminder's policies and documentation, including information relating to safeguarding. The inspector looked at written feedback from parents and carers.
- The inspector asked the childminder questions to assess her understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector and the childminder looked at the children's toys and resources, and discussed how these are used to promote children's learning and development.
